IAEA GSR Part 2 (draft) replacing GS-R-3.

NucSIG commented via ONR/ UK; awaiting news on IAEA meeting held February to take forward member states views.

DS456 included the rationale that the requirements established in the new publication may be used “By the licensee, to specify to a supplier, via contractual documentation, any specific requirements -- that must be included in the supplier’s management system for the supply of items and services”.

Draft DPP for production of guidance

Understand that IAEA propose combining GS-G - 3.1 and 3.5

ISO 9001:2015

That is not a safety based standard – see CQI roadshows.

ISO 19443

ISO are just starting to draft a nuclear specific supply chain standard - based initially from NSQ 100
